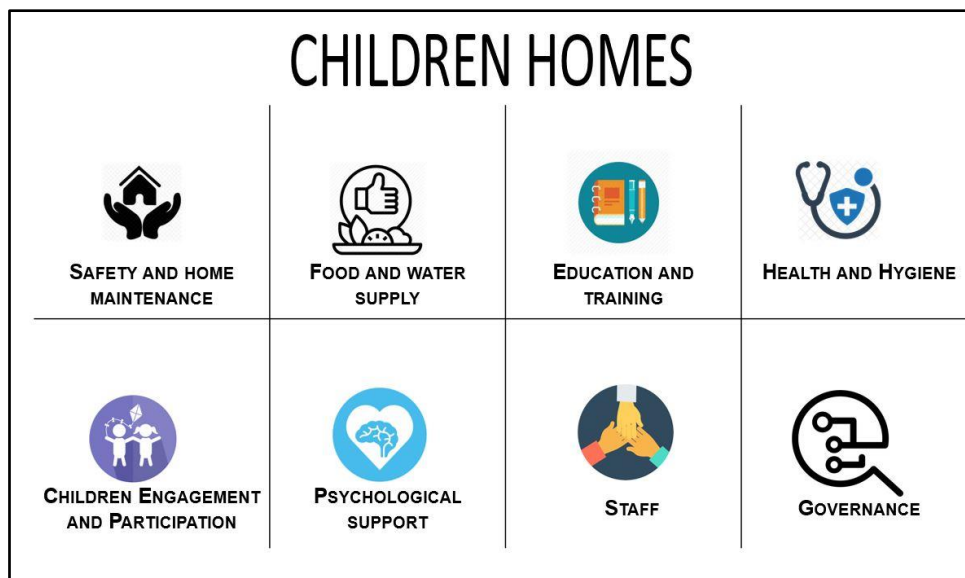

Life Line Trust in this year 2019-2020 continued with three new departments to support the projects implementation apart from Programs and Finance.

1. Quality assurance.
2. Human resource
3. Fund raising

Director headed by these departments and promotes new initiatives through the departments.

1. Quality assurance: They prepared a monthly report formats and Risk assessment templates to improve the quality of the each projects under A. children homes, B. Institutions and C. Community projects. The team first given training on Quality assurance to first level and second level staff team. They covered the major eight components of the children home to ensure quality of the home and care & protection of children and the development of children.



2. Human resource: With the help of HR department, the new staff were recruited based on the ICPS standard and norms. Most of the vacant positions had fulfilled and given induction training to the new staff about the organisation, staff welfare benefits, child protection policy, financial policy and the staff roles and responsibilities and team work. Additional Trainings given by professionals on Child protection policy, finance policy and Counselling.

3. Fund raising: The fund raising department first collected the needs of the children and project. Then, they raised the money or kind donation from donors, well-wishers and corporate companies with the help of digital media and regular follow up of existing donors and well-wishers.

1. Babies Home Annual report April 2019 to March 2020

Life line Trust, Babies home, Salem is started in April -2002. The prime goal is to give maximum service to the babies received either by surrender or abandoned by the biological parent or relatives through In-country adoption for their better rehabilitation and bright future. It is licensed for In –Country adoption by the Government of Tamilnadu.

Baby's intake: In the accounting year April- 2019 to March – 2020, 10 males and 19 females, totally 29 new babies were admitted in Life Line Trust Babies Home. We had received 3 babies (01- female, Male- 02) from Cradle Baby Reception Centre. From that, we had taken 1 female baby from Thanjavur CBS, 2 male babies from CBS, Coimbatore and CBS, Trichy and 8 male, 18 female babies were directly received by Life Line Trust , Salem.



Foster Care

In the accounting year April – 2019 to March 2020, 9 male and 13 female babies were given under In Country adoption. 1 female baby given under Inter Country adoption. All felt happy and pleasure in bringing up their babies.

Legalization:-

Legal, 20 In-country adoption cases and 1 Inter-country adoption cases of adopted babies got legalized. These cases had completed in District Court Salem. He shown more concern on our adopted babies and conducted legal process in an easy and speedy manner.

M.Jeya Durga Devi and S.Kethcee attended three days residential training program on Child Care and Adoption conducted by Central Adoption Resource Authority and State Adoption Resource Authority from 04.03.2020 to 06.03.2020.

Success Story:-

Baby Ruso (LLT/836) Baby Ruso (D.O.B: 29.07.2019) is a surrendered baby and received from The Child Welfare Committee, Pudukkottai on 20.08.2019. Baby was suffered from Severe Bronchopneumonia and Doctor advised us to admit him in hospital on 23.10.2019. During admission, baby was given oxygen support and antibiotics. But due to severe breathing distress, baby was not stable with oxygen. While crying, baby hands and legs changes to blue color. Then Doctor shifted baby to ICU ward and admitted baby in ventilator. Doctor told that he may have heart problem, but they are not able to take confirmation test for heart problem as the baby is in ventilator. Slowly, he became normal and came home. From the echo test, it was resulted as that the baby is normal and we had applied him for adoption. On 31.01.2020, baby Ruso was given under pre adoption foster care to PAP Mr.Kanagavel & Mrs.Sugumari from Chennai.

Death – 03: In the accounting year April – 2019 to March 2020, 1 male and 2 female babies were expired due to severe health problems.

2. Binda Children Home for Girls

Annual Report – April- 2019 to March 2020

Binda Children's home for girl children – Home for rescued victimized girl children from Trafficking and child labour. Binda home is started from July - 2007 and at present functioning in 16, Shanthi nagar, Chinnatirupathi, Salem. There were 49 children present in the beginning of April-2019 and taken care of their education & also their holistic development. Three children were came and five children were reintegrated. One child transferred. In the end of March-2020, 50 children are there in Binda children home.

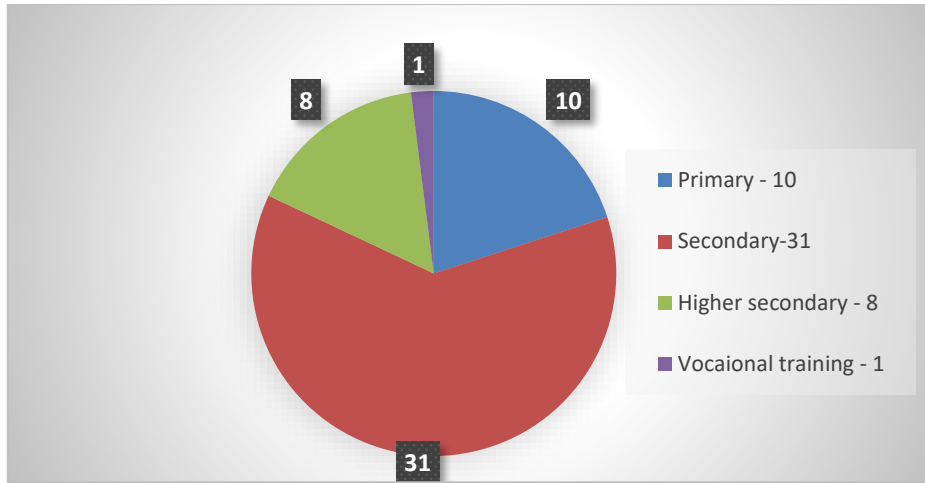
Child protection officer, Mr.Murugan had given training on child protection to Binda children on 24.01.2020.

Reintegration details: There are 7 girls Abitha, Gomathi, Prakashini, Kavitha, Maheswari, T.Anandhi and Jayachitra were reintegrated on this year 2019- 2020.

Transfer: Child S. Nandhini completed 12th in April-2019 and transferred to CWC, Namakkal.

Free Discharge: Two girls Esabella and T.Sivaranjini completed 18 years and discharged from Binda home through CWC, Salem.

Education Status: - For Binda home children appointed two tuition teachers to support their studies in the home. All children were gone to school regularly. For 10th standard, 11th Standard and 12th standard children motivated frequently to get good marks in their public examinations. Computer training given by Hope foundation, Salem to Binda children for 20 classes in Saturdays and school holidays in the months of October 2019 and November 2019 and issued certificates.

Health status:-

Children were quite normal and not affected by major sickness. For minor ailments, immediately consulted the doctor and given treatment and cured in few days. Every three months, Dr.Anurekha had done general check up to Binda children to ensure their normal health.

Birthday activities: - On this year, all children were celebrated their birthday on their birthdays. Children wear new dress, cut their Birthday cake and shared their joy with other children. All children were enjoyed well on their birthday.

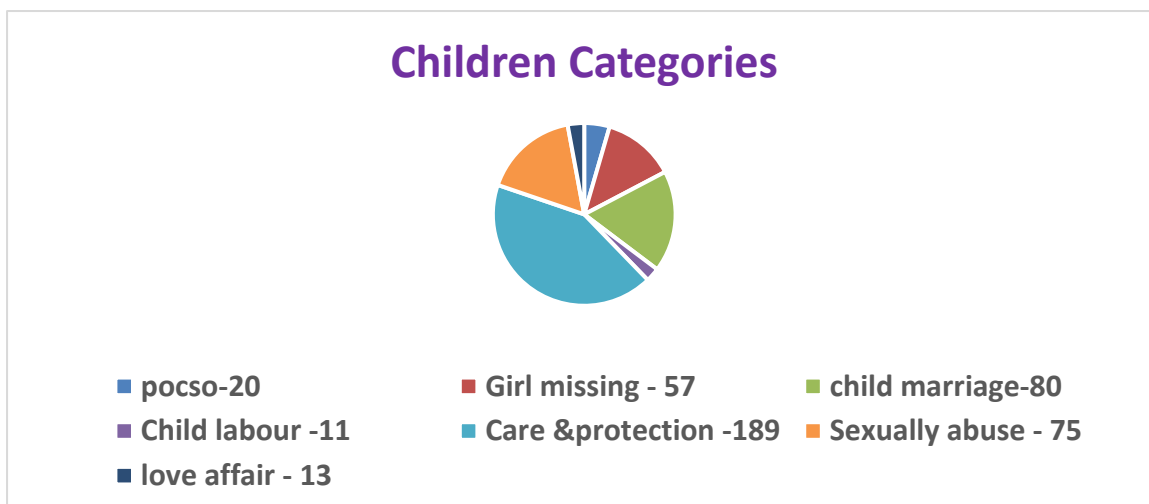
3. Reception Home for Girl Children, Salem

Case study Child Name LLT/RH-2725: Anitha

She is 13 years old girl and studying 8th standard. Her native is Tiruvannamalai District. She used to go Vallalar Temple in Cheyyar. From there one 55 years old man sexually abused her. Her parent noticed her physical changes. Taken her to hospital and confirmed pregnancy. Now she is 9 months pregnant. Parent gave a complaint against the abuser. Then, she was admitted in Tiruvannamalai Reception home on 30.10.2019. For the delivery purpose and better medical care, she was transferred to Salem Reception Home on 16.11.2019. Now the mother and baby were in front of CWC, Tiruvannmalai and given the baby in Adoption. Anitha was reintegrated with her mother on 23.03.2020.

Education Details of Children: From 24 children, 18 kids were gone to School. The remaining six kids are very small, they are not going to school and staying at home and playing happily with toys and the house mother. Schools closed on 17.03.2020 due to Corona precaution and lockdown.



Hospitalization:- TR – 66, Child - Poovarasan

Poovarasan is three years old boy now. His native is Thiruvannamalai. Due to family problem, his mother handed over the child to Thiruvannamalai CWC. For his care and protection he was admitted in reception Home for toddler Unit on 08/02/2018. Poovarasan is having urinary bladder mass and cancer. So, he was admitted in Christian Medical College, Vellore from 04.11.2019 for chemotherapy till time. He will be in hospital for treatment for more than one year. Now for the past six months, he was in treatment of Chemotherapy and radiation treatment and he is getting better.



Case study:- TR – 108, Child Arunesh He is 4 months old male baby. His parent got love married. Her mother side family didn't accept their marriage. So, his Grand-parent sold the boy for 3 lakhs to another family. His parent gave a petition to Salem Collector. Regarding this petition, Attaiyampatty police rescued the baby from Kallakurichi and handed over to Salem CWC. For the care and protection, he was admitted in Reception Home for Toddler unit on 19.11.2019. Then, Through the DCPO and CWC Salem the baby was handed over the parent on 22.11.2019.

MDM Thaleer Children Home inaugurated on 12.12.2012 at No.75B Tamil Nadu Housing Board Poolampatti Road, Edappadi , Salem. At present Address 419/2B, Avaniperur Melmurugan Village, Opposite To Government Middle school chinnamuthur, Edappadi (T.K),Salem District – 637101. Its main objects are providing Care and protection for HIV/AIDS Infected, Neglected, Orphan and abandoned Children. At present, we have 25 children in our MDM Thaleer Children Home.

8. Life Line Centre for Prevention of Children from Alcoholism and Substances (Drug) Abuses.

Lifeline Centre for prevention of children from alcoholism and substance (Drug) Abuses began admitting the children from **23/02/2018**. We provide proper medical support, Nutritious food, individual counselling, family counselling, re- educative lectures. During the stay, house visits were made to assess the socio and family structure of the child. Follow up services offered after the discharge to ensure sobriety and guide them further. Referral services (Job, vocational training, ITI or school) were made to improve the qualitative life of the children. Children are coming from all over Tamilnadu through CWC (39) and JJB(44).
